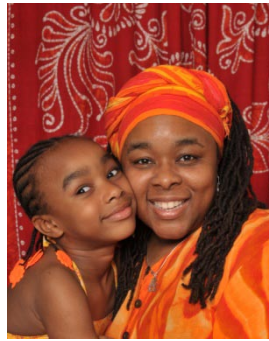




## About the Author
